## **Albuquerque Man Indicted On Attempted Tax Evasion Charges**

SANTA FE – An Albuquerque man has been indicted on attempted tax evasion charges for allegedly not paying his taxes from January 2007 through October 2008.

A grand jury with the First Judicial District in Santa Fe on Thursday returned indictments against Mark Gallipoli on 16 counts of attempts to evade or defeat tax. If convicted of all these charges, Gallipoli, 47, could face a maximum sentence of 16 years in prison and \$160,000 in fines.

“Individuals like Mr. Gallipoli are given numerous opportunities to come clean and pay their fair share of taxes. But when that fails, we will go after them aggressively and bring the full weight of the law against them,” said Rick Homans, Cabinet Secretary for the New Mexico Taxation & Revenue Department.

The indictment is the result of an investigation conducted by the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department’s Tax Fraud Investigations Division.
