Albuquerque Man Pleads Guilty To Tax Evasion Charges

SANTA FE – An Albuquerque man was sentenced to three years probation and ordered to pay over \$27,000 in back taxes after he pleaded guilty today to four counts of tax evasion charges.

State District Court Judge Stephen D. Pfeffer in Santa Fe accepted the plea and sentenced Mark Gallipoli, 48, of La Cueva Construction in Albuquerque. Gallipoli must file corrected returns for 16 originally charged tax periods, file correct returns while on probation, and make restitution to the state.

In April, a grand jury with the First Judicial District in Santa Fe indicted Mark Gallipoli on 16 counts of attempts to evade or defeat tax. The indictment charged that he failed to pay taxes from January 2007 through October 2008.

The indictment is the result of an investigation conducted by the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department's Tax Fraud Investigations Division.
