Delinquent property tax auctions scheduled

SANTA FE—The Taxation and Revenue Department has scheduled delinquent property tax auctions in Lincoln, Santa Fe, Rio Arriba and Colfax counties.

The state attempts to collect delinquent property taxes when counties are unable to do so. If the state is unable to collect the delinquent taxes, the subject properties are auctioned for sale.

Auctions have been scheduled in the following counties:

Lincoln County. When: 10 a.m., Tuesday, Oct. 4, 2022. Where: 300 Central Avenue, Carrizozo.

Santa Fe County. When: 10 a.m., Wednesday, Oct. 5, 2022. Where: Harold Runnels Building, Larrazolo Auditorium, 1190 St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe.

Rio Arriba County. When: 10 a.m., Thursday, Oct. 6, 2022. Where: Rio Arriba County Courthouse, 1122 Industrial Park Road, Española.

Colfax County. When: 10 a.m., Wednesday, Oct. 12, 2022. Where: 230 North 3rd Street, Raton.

More information, including terms of the auction sales, is available at <u>tax.newmexico.gov</u>. Announcements of future auctions also will be available there.

Registration begins in person one hour before the auction starts and ends promptly at auction time. Bidders must be registered to participate.
