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Local governments received \$2 billion in GRT distributions

Municipalities, counties and other local governments received a little over \$2 billion in gross receipts taxes in the 2019 fiscal year, up 8 percent from the previous year, according to new figures from the Taxation and Revenue Department.

Recently completed, final audited figures showed municipalities received about \$1.4 billion, counties received nearly \$600 million and tribes received \$9.6 million. The table below provides the exact amount for each category for Fiscal Years 2018 and 2019 and the percentage increase.
